

"Moving away from somewhat cliché interiors, there is room for personality, perhaps even a little fantasy. Nature features prominently, with foliage motifs and natural textures. Rugged textures such as bark are paired with precious finishes for a new take on rough-luxury. Precious, in fact, is the new byword, with gold rediscovered in contemporary finishes such as satin gold that are at the opposite end of the spectrum to 'bling'. The new Precious is understated, as much about revealing and appreciating craftsmanship as it is about glamour. Gold is teamed with intense, sophisticated colours that set it off, such as burnt orange, ruby or a deep shade of turquoise blue with green undertones. *Simon Rawlings, creative director of David Collins Studio:*

"At David Collins Studio we tend to steer away from trends, working in a different way by building up narratives within our designs in order to create something that is truly timeless. That said, there are obvious trends from season to season in design. For 2016, those that I think will be apparent are: sophisticated colour clashing – blocks of strong, but muted colours used to excess; the use of ceramic instead of marble – there are so many fabulous ceramics for wall and floors; coloured stained woods; leaded glass and patchworked fabrics."
